



TECHNICAL COLLEGE OF THE LOWCOUNTRY COMPLETION RATES FOR THE ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN NURSING (ADN) REPORT

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About this Report

Purpose

The Technical College of the Lowcountry (TCL) Completion Rates for Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) Report presents completions rates for the students in the ADN program between academic years 2015-2016 and 2020-2021. A seven-semester longitudinal tracking for academic years between 2021-2022 and 2024-2025 was not possible at this time. The Completion Rates presented in this report considers the student a completer if the student confers the Associate Degree in Nursing award within a 150% or seven consecutive semesters (fall and spring only).

Data Sources

For this report, data were derived from TCL's student information system course enrollment and graduate records reports on SQL Server Reporting Services and were retrieved on March 3, 2025.

Definitions/Terms

ADN Cohort

The ADN Cohort is the Associate Degree in Nursing program cohort which includes students who attempted the following three courses during a single semester fall or spring: 1) NUR-102/Basic Nursing Care Skills; 2) NUR-134/Beginning Nursing Skills; and 3) NUR-105/Pharmacology for Nurses.

Completer

A student in an ADN Cohort is counted as a "completer" if he/she confers the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) award within 150% of program time or within the seven consecutive fall/spring semesters.

Seven (7)-Semester Longitudinal Tracking

Students in the ADN Cohort are tracked for seven (7) consecutive semesters (fall and spring only). For example, a student in the Fall 2018 ADN Cohort will be tracked through Fall 2021.

Calculation

Total number of ADN Cohort students who conferred an ADN Award within the 150% or within the seven consecutive fall and spring semesters divided by the total number of students in the ADN cohort multiplied by 100%.

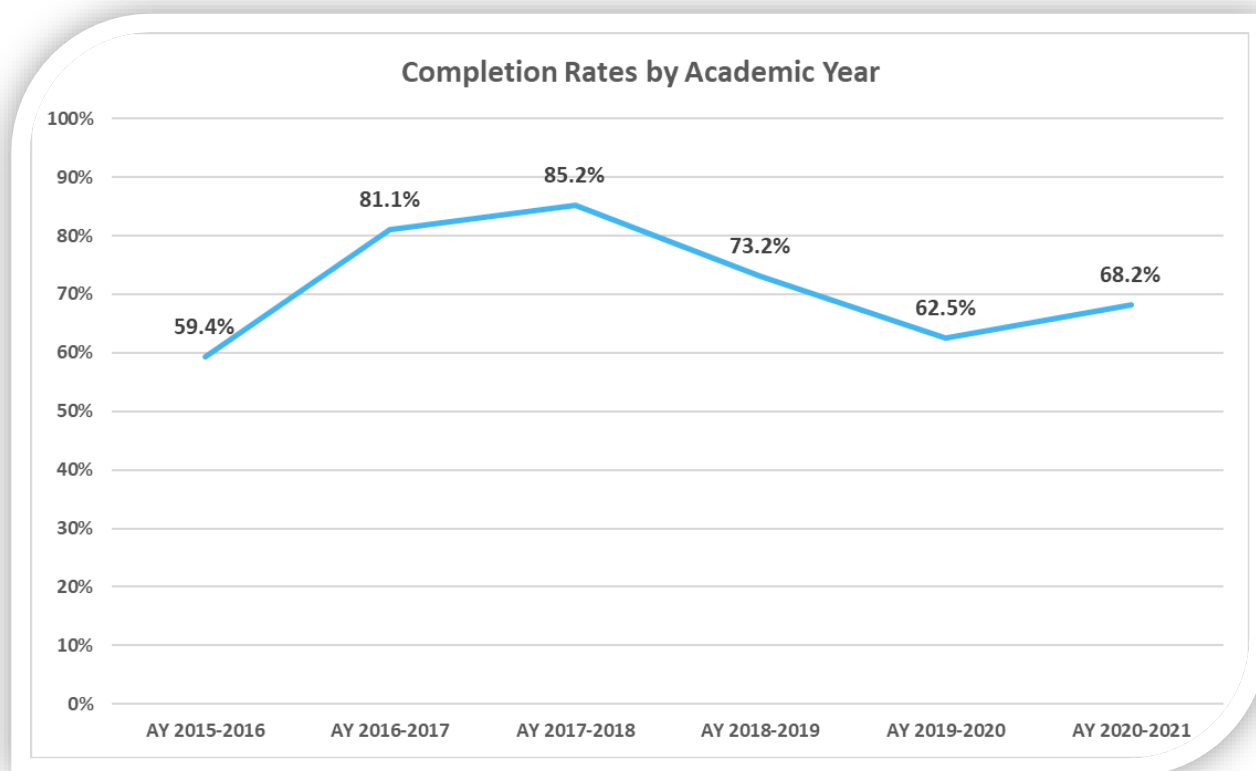

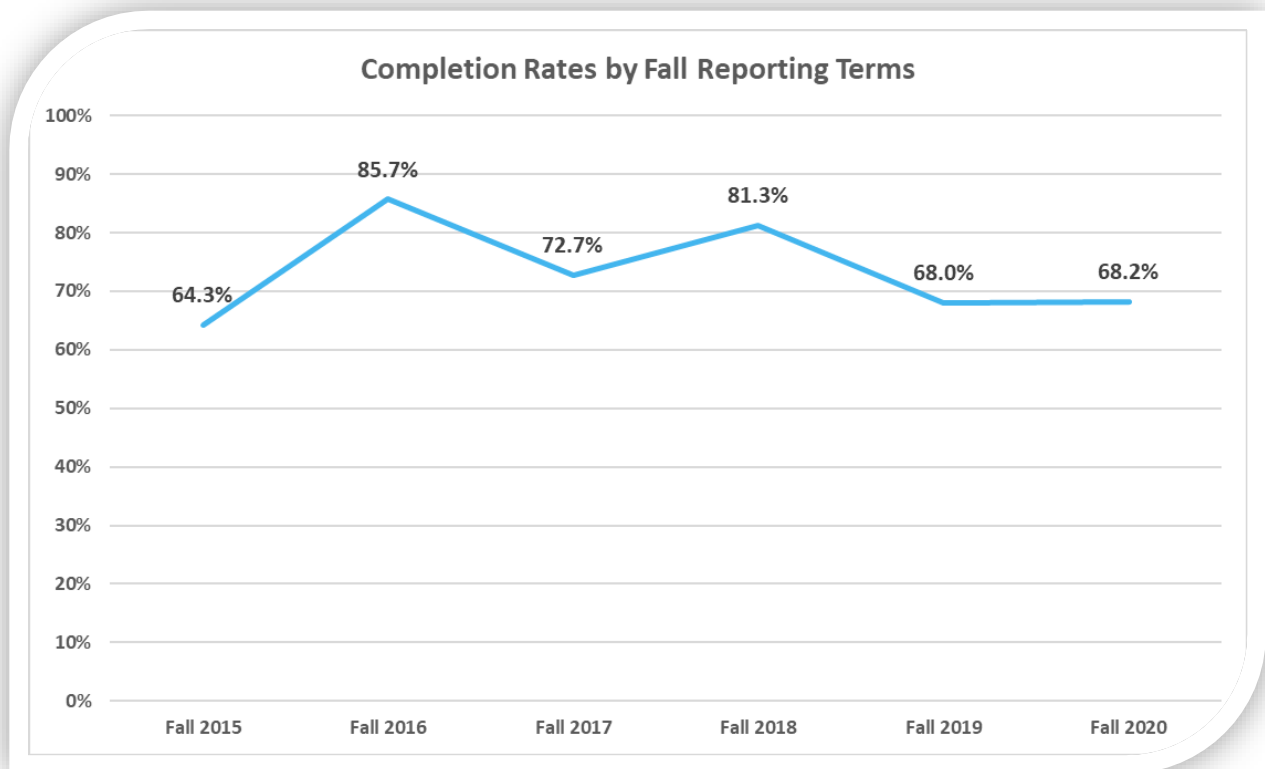
Graphic: Completion Rates by Academic Year

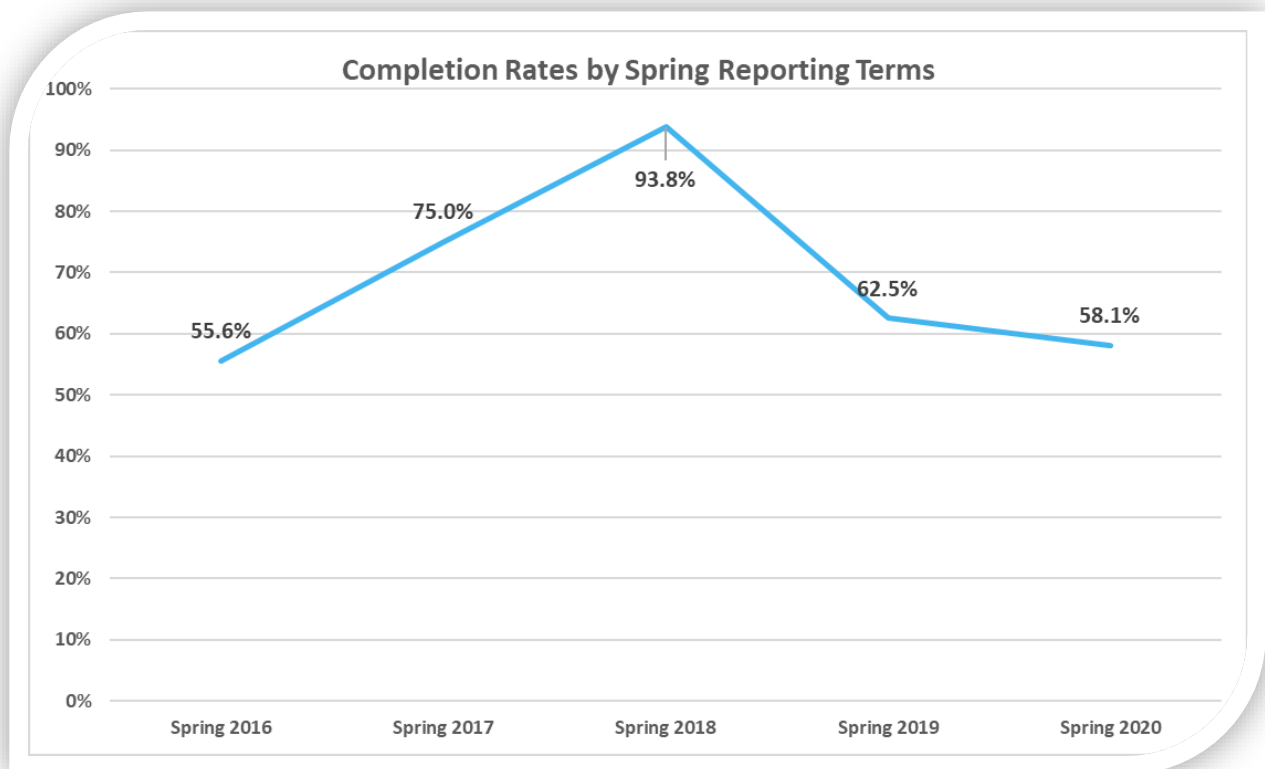
Graphic: Completion Rates by Fall Reporting Terms
